## COLLEGE-LEVEL SCHOLARSHIPS

### **The AREMA Educational Foundation Undergraduate Scholarship (\$1000) - Deadline: March 15**

The AREMA Educational Foundation Undergraduate Scholarship is available to full-time sophomores, juniors and seniors enrolled in a four- or five-year program leading to a bachelor's degree in engineering or engineering technology. You must have a minimum 2.0 GPA to be eligible for this award. A resume, transcript, two letters of recommendation and a cover letter are required.

The CarDonors.com Scholarship is available to students who are attending or planning to attend an accredited U.S. college in the 2005-2006 school year. You must have a minimum 3.0 GPA and be in good standing at your current institution.

The Nonprofit Sector Research Fund, a grantmaking program of the Aspen Institute in Washington, DC, annually offers the William Randolph Hearst Endowed Scholarship. The scholarship, which is based on academic excellence and need, is open to both undergraduate and graduate students who are members of minority groups. The Hearst Scholar serves as a summer intern with the Fund. Through this program, the Fund seeks to introduce a diverse group of students to issues relating to philanthropy, voluntarism, and nonprofit organizations. Recipients may arrange with their colleges or universities to receive academic credit for this experience.

### **The A. Patrick Charnon Scholarship (\$1500) - Deadline: March 31 (but only the first 250 complete applications will be accepted)**

The A. Patrick Charnon Scholarship is open to full-time undergraduate students who have been accepted to or who are currently enrolled in a four-year college or university. Students who value tolerance, compassion and respect for all people in their communities, and who have demonstrate their commitments to these values by their actions will be considered for this award. In addition to an official transcript and three letters of recommendation, you must submit a typed 2-4 page essay on how community service experiences have shaped your life and how you will use your college education to build communities in a manner consistent with Pat Charnon's values of compassion, tolerance, generosity and respect.

To qualify for the scholarship award, the applicant must be currently enrolled in an accredited school of nursing, and be a United States citizen or legal resident of the United States.

The Hispanic College Fund, Inc. Scholarship is open to students of Hispanic heritage who are pursuing careers in business, science or engineering. You must be a U.S. citizen or permanent resident, be studying full time in the United States or Puerto Rico, have a minimum 3.0 GPA, and demonstrate financial need to be eligible for this award. Students pursuing masters degrees in business administration are also eligible.

**American Dream Scholarship (\$500-\$5000) - Deadline: April 15**

Established in partnership with the United Negro College Fund, the American Dream Scholarship Program is open to African-Americans with financial need. Applicants must be U.S. citizens or permanent residents, with a minimum 2.5 grade point average (on a 4.0 scale), who meet Pell Grant eligibility criteria, and are enrolled full-time at approved, accredited, undergraduate institutions.

**The BPW Career Advancement Scholarship Program (varies) – Deadline: April 15**

The BPW Career Advancement Scholarship Program is open to female students who are at least 25 years of age. You must be a U.S. citizen, demonstrate clear career plans and critical financial need, and plan to graduate or receive certification between December 1, 2006 and August 31, 2008. You must also attend or be accepted into an accredited program or course of study at a United States institution, including institutions in Puerto Rico and the Virgin Islands. Students earning a doctoral-level or terminal degree, such as a PhD, MD, DDS, DVM, JD, etc. are not eligible.

Applicants are required to submit a resume along with their application. The annual scholarship award is \$2,500 and full-time enrollment verification is required before fund disbursement.

The Stephen Phillips Memorial Scholarship is open to students who demonstrate financial need. The award is also available to any student who is currently attending college. High school students must rank in the top 20 percent of their graduating class and have a minimum 3.0 GPA to be considered for this award. Currently enrolled students must have a minimum 3.0 GPA. You must also demonstrate a balance of community, school and work activities. An essay and letters of recommendation will need to be submitted with your application. Applicants must live in one of the following states: Connecticut, Delaware, the District of Columbia, Maine, Maryland, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, Vermont, Virginia and West Virginia.

**HSF/McNamara Family Creative Arts Project for Hispanics (up to \$20,000) – Deadline: May 14**

Participants in this rotational cooperative program will alternate semesters of full-time work with full-time study from entry into the program until graduation. You must work a minimum of 52 weeks prior to graduation and salaries are competitive and determined by your degree progress. You must also have experience in computer programming languages and have highly developed operations research skills. Additionally, you must be a U.S. citizen, be a second-semester freshmen or sophomore, have at least a 3.0 GPA, and be eligible to be granted a security clearance.

Up to four students may work together as a team. However, only one prize will be awarded per entry.
